

NORTHLAND POLL JULY 2023

- CLIENT:** REALITY CHECK RADIO
- POLL DATES:** Thursday 20 July 2023. The median response was collected on Thursday 20 July 2023.
- TARGET POPULATION:** Adults in the Northland electorate.
- SAMPLE POPULATION:** Adults in the Northland electorate who are contactable on a landline or mobile phone.
- SAMPLE SIZE:** 400 respondents agreed to participate.
- SAMPLE SELECTION:** A random selection of 5,000 phone numbers who live in Northland.
- WEIGHTING:** The results are weighted to reflect the overall electorate voting population in terms of gender and age.
- SAMPLE ERROR:** Based on this sample of 400 respondents, the maximum sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 4.5%, at the 95% confidence level.
- CODE COMPLIANCE:** This poll was conducted in accordance with the Research Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social Research.
